## TRANSFORMING LIVES AFFECTED BY ADDICTION, VIOLENCE AND LOSS

### Addiction Recovery

Partnering with the Service League of San Mateo County, we operate Tim's House, a transitional housing establishment for young men in active recovery from addiction. Residents at Tim's House undergo an intensive treatment program for substance abuse, while focusing on skill development, job training, health and well-being.

Our Meadowlark Retreats offer intensive grief support for mothers and fathers who have suffered the sudden loss of a child. We honor and comfort parents as they learn to live the unthinkable—a life without a child they adored. Additionally, we provide grants to other organizations serving those who have experienced loss.
